## DAILY LIFTTRUCK INSPECTION CHECKLIST



To help contribute to a safer working environment and prevent costly lift truck repairs, it is important to inspect your forklifts regularly as part of your daily or pre-shift inspection. Defective lift trucks should be reported to a supervisor, and the operator should discontinue use upon detection of any unsafe condition.

Here's a quick list of what to inspect:

- 1 Tire condition / wheel nuts
- 2 Hydraulic oil level and hoses
- 3 Hoist, tilt and attachment operation
- 4 Forks, mast and hoist chain
- 5 Lights, horn and fire extinguisher
- 6 Hand and service brake

- 7 Steering
- 8 Correct operation of instruments
- <sup>9</sup> Forklift body, seat and seatbelt
- 10 Report oil leaks or unusual noises
- 11 Noise exhaust
